### Title I

### **Schoolwide Program Plan**

Under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, J.C. Martin Elementary qualifies as a Schoolwide Title I Campus. Because of this, additional federal funding is provided and allows for the enhancement of the entire educational program in our campus. Our goal at J.C. Martin Elementary, is that ALL students (English Language Learners, Economicaly Disadvantaged, Special Education and Gifted and Talented) exhibit proficient and advanced levels in the state assessment. Our schoolwide programs and strategies are designed to assist students in meeting their goals through individual improvement plans. In order to continously improve the quality of instruction, teachers are provided effective and meaningful professional development. All together, with the assistance of our parents and community, we will help our students succeed in becoming productive citizens of society.

### **Ten Schoolwide Components**

### 1: Comprehensive Needs Assessment

The Comprehensive Needs Assessment is an important tool of the planning process. The Campus needs are identified, data is evaluated, and a campus improvement plan is developed by the different committees. This plan is evaluated throughout the year.

#### 2: Schoolwide Reform Strategies

J.C. Martin Elementary uses reform strategies that provide opportunities for all students to meet the state's proficient or advanced levels of student performance. These strategies are used to improve student achievement. In addition, we create campus performance goals and ensure that we have an alignment between curriculum, instruction, and assessment. All strategies are aligned to the district initiatives.

#### 3: Instruction by highly qualified professional teachers

J.C. Martin Elementay is a Title I Campus where the teachers and staff are highly qualified and meet the standard of expectation. Professional development is provided at the campus level and at the district level throughout the school year. The Staffing Committee convenes and follows the district interview process to select the best candidate for the position when there is a vacancy.

### 4: High-quality and ongoing professional development for teachers, principals, and paraprofessionals and, if appropriate, student services personnel, parents, and other staff

High-quality professional development is provided to all our faculty and staff members at J.C. Martin Elementary. All professional development provided is aligned to the district and campus initiatives.

### 5: Strategies to attract highly qualified teachers

Prior to campuses interviewing, all applicants are screened by Laredo ISD's Human Resource Department. Because of this, only highly qualified teachers reach the campuses for interviews. A mentor is then assigned to the new teacher once they are hired in order to provide additional support.

### 6: Strategies to increase parental involvement

J.C. Martin Elementary holds different activities throughout the year such as monthly informative sessions aligned with the counselor's topics for students, family nights, assessment nights, AR nights, and report card nights to promote parental involvement. We also have extra curricular activities where parents serve as coaches or sponsors. We maintain constant communication with parents both written and verbal through conferences, phone calls, and the Home School Connection (Eng./Span.).

#### 7: Plans for assisting preschool children in the transition from early childhood programs to elementary school programs

J.C. Martin Elementary teachers will review student information of those children coming from the headstart program to ensure that a smooth transition takes place. Parents, along with their children, are welcome to tour the school. The school's parent liaision coordinates the tours.

### 8: Measures to include teachers in the decisions regarding the use of academic assessments in order to improve the achievement of individual students and the overall instructional program

J.C. Martin Elementary follows the district's curriculum (TEKS Resource System) and utilizes the unit assessments. In order to identify areas of need, teachers use other assessment tools such as curriculum based assessments (CBA's), C-PALLS, TPRI, TELPAS and STAAR.
